Assistance Helps Farmers, Ranchers Conserve Natural Resources

Application deadline for financial assistance Nov. 17

GAINESVILLE, Fla., Sept. 20, 2017 — Florida farmers, ranchers and forest owners can apply until Nov. 17 for financial and technical assistance from USDA's <u>Natural Resources Conservation</u> <u>Service (NRCS) Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)</u> for fiscal year 2018 funding. Although applications are accepted on a continuous basis for all programs, funding selections are typically made once a year.

Through EQIP, agricultural landowners may receive financial and technical assistance to improve soil, water, air, plants, animals and related resources. Eligible land includes cropland, rangeland, pastureland, private non-industrial forestland and other farm or ranch lands. The application deadline also applies to the following EQIP-funded initiatives:
